Member: how is this going to be distributed? A: bank in Squamish does an oral health care project, accepting donations, most likely place

5. Fine Arts Department Presentation	Christina McAllister
Ms McAllister & 3 students	
Ms McAllister:	
Thank you for the fundraising, it helped with the royalty costs for Little Shop of Horrors, first musical at Alpha in over 20 years	
Gearing up for presentation in June; using live music not recordings, students prepping as "triple threats"; carpentry being done by students from other classes, Mr Beauregard to help with sets, also graffiti artist, so cross-curricular benefits; will likely continue to ask for PAC help w future shows; royalties can run \$2,000-7,000, your location can affect the price, each individual performance costs a royalty fee; using Michael J Fox theatre costs \$1,750 per night as well, so using Alpha studio despite small size & difficulty recouping costs; renting equipment including the full size Audrey plant adds up; assorted teachers coming in to play music as well; royalties for early access (longer rehearsal time) are a couple hundred dollars a month, script & score not released until about a month prior to show dates; students bring joy and 'find their village' in theatre, it's a safe space for all kinds of students, kids come at lunch and after school	
Students acting in play:	

 -learned a lot, love theatre program; more confident, gained life skills, lots of opportunities to grow as a person & make strong friendships -major impact, have been in musicals from early age, very excited to be doing Little Shop of Horrors; theatre is fantastic opportunity to let teens come out of their shell, be creative, be comfortable with public speaking and many other skills -have done acting but also tried Tech and loved it, appreciated the chance to try multiple aspects of productions; boosted confidence, more comfortable being expressive, community very supportive 	
Q: How to buy tickets? A: using Curate so sales can be done right up to day of performance, better tracking, sales will start in May	
Q: What is for sale on Cash Online A: Fundraiser: succulent plants	
Q: How much are tickets to the play? A: Adults \$20, students \$15	
Q: How much is the department asking for? A: Not asking anything specific, came to say thank you and show PAC some of what's involved and how much it helps when any funds are directed to theatre	
Q: Do you ever need to hire theatre teachers? A: It's an extra cost, so we try not to, and so far haven't had to do it	
Q: Is there a dream theatre you want to use? Michael J Fox? Could you fill it? A: We could fill MJF, students often have huge families & lots of friends who want to come but can't when we use the Alpha studio. It would be awesome to have that, but the cost is prohibitive. Always open to suggestions, help, etc. in that vein. Member: I have a family member who does work connecting non-profits with theatre venues	
Q: Ever talked to Shadbolt? A: Yes, but very expensive, MJF actually cheapest option–gets harder when you use bigger venue because other bookings need to get in & out as well	
Vivien: mentioned Hasting Merchants Association willing to do calendar w student art as fundraiser	
Ms Lee: district does a really good job funding the arts overall	
6. Principal's Report	Victoria Lee

Thank you for supporting Hannah's fundraiser and the theatre students–means a lot when people value what students are doing	
Fee increases next year: SFU charging more for school leaving going up to \$105 per student (district actually helping offset on top of that); dinner & dance will be up by \$10; school student fee goes up to \$35: goes to gr 8 agendas, locks for lockers, student govt, student leadership (\$5); AP exam fees going up by \$20	
Robotics team made the Nationals, could go to Worlds but have decided not to (went last year)	
Dance team came in 2nd at festival, small but growing program	
Pink shirt day–good turnout and support	
French Immersion program holding carnival for students tomorrow; some kids just came back from real Carnivale in Quebec	
CARES committee doing more, hearing from more students about their cultural holidays, supporting more celebrations so kids can see their cultures represented/celebrated; big Easter event coming up	
Star Search recently	
Working on another student survey, maybe next year (e.g. the CARES committee came out of last year's survey); anti-racism committee continuing to work on projects	
Library was voted safest space in school, Connect was second	
Gr 12's gearing up for lots of activities: luncheon, Capstone presentations, organized events like laser tag; grad activities plus other things to allow for getting together	
Q: Liquor store money: how is that given to dry grad? A: District sorts it out, schools sign up for it & gets divvied up	
Q: How is the 5 block schedule going to work? A: Gr 11 & 12 students will come for 1st period (some will have study block then), gr 8,9,10 courses will start in 2nd period	
Q: Access & bus schedule conflicts? A: Even for gr 11/12, should still work out, Access bus schedule will line up with periods 2-5, EAs will mostly be for periods 2-5	
Q: I have kids in both gr 9 and 11, how to figure out scheduling drop off/pick up?	

A: Schedules won't be available until Sept, so won't know til then if older will start period 1—all gr 11 & 12 will have a spare in each semester
