Q: Do students actually call you?	
A: Yes, they call and text; former students still call	
Q: We are very lucky to have you; my daughter as an Access student may not know when to	
call you, are there provisions for that?	
A: Yes, I make an effort to go around and include the Access students in my rounds	

Q: That's great but what about any further ways for the Access kids to reach out to you (hand signals, etc), not always comfortable with phones? A: Excellent point, let's brainstorm that

Q: Sounds like you overlap with the counsellors A: Seems like overlap but I am not a counsellor so I will ensure kids that need that support get it

COMMENT: Committee of the Whole meeting recently talked about accessibility & public safety--RCMP Youth Officers can be invited to come in and talk to students about public safety, has to be done by principal [Vivien] A: Send me the info

Q: If a student isn't feeling safe, how do they know what to do? A: Generally we encourage students to reach out to an adult, any adult, to help, ideally. Sometimes it doesn't work that way, kids may not want to talk to adults who don't know them-hopefully chatting with them, acknowledging them, throughout the days and months opens that door. Often teachers, counsellors, parents, Wendel will connect to ensure a student can get some support when someone notices a need

Q: Do you meet with other Safety Officers and share info?A: Yes a couple times a month or so-builds rapport and networks among schools

Q: Have you seen anyone recruiting for gangs in the schools here? A: It doesn't show up like the stereotypes, but we share info among the schools and try to be aware of anything going on around the schools and work with staff to note anything significant happening around the school

Q: Were the two people found dead outside the school connected to the school? A: No, from the news accounts they were actually from another municipality and not student age

Q: So when you hear about trouble spots nearby do you go there? A: I kind of make the rounds generally to just be aware, not necessarily to respond to urgent problems in the moment

Q: So what happens with the safety protocols with multiple buildings on site? A: (Ms Watson) We have the 3 levels of precaution, so it will basically stay the same (shelter in place, hold & secure, lockdown). It's on the district website, same across the district; the different types are practised with notice sent to parents in advance. Part of these situations can involve asking students not to be on their phones if possible, rumours can spread, parents can show up at the school during critical situations. Once a month some kind of drill or emergency preparedness is carried out.

Q: What's your background, how did you get into this work? A: Came here to play football in the early 80s; have always worked with kids during high school and beyond; worked at adolescent treatment centre in Burnaby; when School Safety

Specialist positions came up in '94 I went for it; I believe people should be treated with respect and that informs everything I do
