2. Approval of Minutes from October 16, 2023, Meeting

Motion to approve from Donna; seconded by Melanie; no opposition; passed.

3. Presentation from Student Council

Michael and Sylvia, co-presidents for Student Council this year, gave presentation. Council is made up of a full Executive, reps from each grade, Indigenous reps, technical rep. They meet weekly, every Tuesday morning at 7:30am.

They plan activities for students like Spirit Days, pancake breakfasts, dances, Ho-Ho-Down, valentine's day, food truck Fridays, easter egg hunt, year-end carnival.

Possible PAC assistance includes:

- Parent encouragement for students to participate with Council events as they struggle with student engagement.

- Hope for 300 tickets sold.
- Tickets will be sold in person at lunch (cash accepted) and available on School Cash Online.
- There will be a cut-off date for ticket sales and no tickets sold at the door.
- Last year sold 180 tickets, wasn't enough sales, and was only for grades 10-12's.

4. Principal's Report - Mr. Paré

Reviewed Emergency Response Guidelines.

Types of Drills:

Fire, Bomb Threat, Gas Leak

Notification: fire alarm or PA announcement

Response: evacuate **Earthquake, Explosions**Notification: feel shaking

Response: Drop, cover, hold on

Outdoor Safety Hazard – when there is a threat outside the building ("Shelter in Place")

E.g., wild animal, extreme weather Notification: PA announcement Response: shelter in place

Neighborhood security concern ("Hold and Secure")

E.g., gas station close to Alpha being robbed, police presence at nearby home, potentially dangerous situation in the community

Notification: PA announcement

Response: Hold in the school and secure the school

Note: works well when everyone is in the school and in class; difficult when in a

transition and kids are outside.

Threat in the Building Concern ("Lockdown")

Notification: PA announcement

Response: Lockdown (not a hold and secure) – away from windows, huddled down in

the dark, everyone stays in that position until police come to the rooms.

Note: Administrative staff must also Lockdown.

At Alpha:

- Regular drills are held
- School has been seismically updated
- On October 19, 2023, participated in the Great BC Shakeout
- November 22 is a Lockdown drill
- Blinds for classrooms some rooms have special Lockdown blinds, only meant to be down for a Lockdown. Rooms that don't have them are rooms where it is possible to hide and not be seen from the windows.
- Parent letter going out November 2023.
- Administration takes VTRA (Violent Threat Risk Assessment) training
- They do de-briefs and scenarios, e.g., reviewed Mountain Lockdown last Spring

5. Chairperson's Report - Maria

PAC Fundraising - Maria has been managing the fundraising and has several volunteers to take on fundraising pieces. Current fundraisers include:

- SPC cards sold 100 to date, \$10 via School Cash Online, 450 providers give discounts with this card. Sales close on Friday Nov 10. PAC takes home \$3.50 from each card.
- **Purdy's** Stacie S. Closing date is Nov 25 and will be delivered on Dec 8. PAC will send link out. Sales open Nov 10. First \$500.00 sold we get 5%; over that. 25%.
- Cob's Bread at Kensington mention Alpha and 5% of the sale got to Alpha PAC.
- Return it at Kensington Bottle depot Bag it and tag it to Alpha School. PAC gets all the money. Bag must be translucent. Use school phone number to print the label. Working on it being accepted at other Return-its.

6. Vice-Chairperson's Report - Gloria

No report.

7. Treasurer's Report - Janice

In October PAC received the annual gaming grant, \$22,920, based on last years head count, \$20 per student.

Gaming grant must be used within 36 months.

Gaming grant has restrictions on how funds can be spent.

School Cash Online donations and general funds spending is more flexible.

Gaming Grant funds usually go towards teacher wish list items. Staff give their list at end of November to Mr. Paré, he reviews it and presents to PAC.

Decisions on spending are made at PAC meetings. Requests come in, are discussed at PAC meeting, and voted on.

PAC will discuss creating a budget for future spending of the General account.

8. Parent Representative Reports

Sally – grade 9 rep – reported that at the recent parent teacher online meetings, some parents struggled with hearing the teachers.

c. Fundraising parent volunteer update:

- d. New English Language Learner (ELL) parent volunteer update:

- e. **Athletics Update:** Basketball Coaches needed ASAP:
 - Grade 8 girls' basketball
 - Grade 9 girls' basketball
 - Grade 10 girls' basketball
 - Sr girls (grade 11 and 12) Basketball
 - Grade 8 boys Basketball
 - Grade 9 boys Basketball

Additional details from Amber Norris, Athletic Director, provided post-meeting: Will take up to 6 hours a week. There are often 2 practices and 2 games, but this may vary depending on the schedule. (Some weeks may have 3 games, some 1, and some may have no games)

Practices can be in the mornings (7-8:30 am) or after school. Athletic Director tries to accommodate parents and community coaches as best they can. Gr. 10, 11, and 12 games are on Mondays and Wednesdays (for the most part). Jr. games are at 5:30 and Sr. games are at 7:00

Gr. 8 games are mostly on Mondays and Wednesdays but are also on some Tuesdays and Thursdays. Grade 8 games are at 4:00.

Gr. 9 games are on Tuesdays and Thursdays (with some possible exceptions) Gr. 9 girls' games are mostly at 4:00 but will be at 5:00 if there is a gr. 8 game beforehand. Gr. 9 boys' games are at 5:30, and the occasional game at 7:00. Some knowledge of the game is helpful, but school is looking for anyone who is willing to coach. A big part is endurance training and getting them moving as it is a high energy game. A person does not need to have experience. Although we may eventually get there, basketball is not our strongest Alpha sport, so just being able to have a coach to have a team and participate is all we need. Our league games are in Burnaby and New Westminster. The one exception is gr. 9 girls where there will be one game played at Heritage Woods in Coquitlam. 10. New Business

a. Hybrid options for PAC meetings - Maria

The PAC investigated utilizing hybrid options for our meetings. The technical piece to do so is complicated. The PAC also decided to focus on building connections with families and the Alpha Community though in-person engagement. To support families that are unable to attend a PAC meeting, the PAC has initiated:

- Sending the previous meeting Minutes with the upcoming meeting Agenda the Friday before each PAC Meeting.
- Having the meetings begin at 7pm.
- Sending out a PAC Monthly Update email (last one sent October 26, 2023)
- A link with information on how to connect with the PAC is available at the Alpha School Website at https://alpha.burnabyschools.ca/parent-advisory-council/

b. School expansion project update - Vivien

This year, Alpha has 1,250 students enrolled. There is a District Plan which forecasted the year 2025 to be 1,209 students. This expected growth has been achieved sooner than expected. Alpha is over its capacity and nearby elementary schools are over their maximum capacity too. i.e., year 2025 (150-180%) for Kitchener and Brentwood Park.

There is no plan for an Alpha expansion.

Parents signed up to join a PAC subcommittee on this topic. Please let the PAC know if you'd like to join.

It was brought up that students might want to also be involved, perhaps the Debate team.

It was noted the BC Govt only builds to current numbers, not to future numbers.

c. Decision re: DPAC Representative voting - Maria

PAC Constitution & Bylaws (C&Bs) being revised this year due to many outdated protocols.

PAC C&Bs require District Parent Advisory Council (DPAC) rep vote be done by secret ballot. PAC held two elections for the 2023-24 year and did not do a secret ballot for DPAC rep.

BC School Act Legislation also mentions a secret ballot is required for DPAC reps. Discussion re: the BC School Act Legislation not mentioning having DPAC alternates vs. the Burnaby DPAC Act which allows alternates, and Alpha has two alternate DPAC reps.

Discussion on the Alpha PAC being guided by the BC School Act vs. the Burnaby DPAC act.

Melanie made a motion to have an election by secret ballot for the DPAC rep at the next PAC meeting.

Melanie decided to withdraw her motion. Melanie asked it to be noted in the minutes that she disagrees with the PAC continuing the rest of the 2023-24 year with not having a secret ballot DPAC vote and with having alternate DPAC reps.

Thank you so much for taking the time to read this letter and consider contributing to Alpha's annual Ho Ho Down event.



SCHOLARSHIPS vs BURSARIES

SCHOLARSHIP

- are grants or payments made to support a student's education
- awarded for academic achievement, financial need, community service, leadership ability, etc.

BURSARIES

are awarded solely for financial need.



BOTH = FREE MONEY

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS

- Alpha School Scholarships
- Burnaby School District Scholarships
- Provincial Government Scholarships
- Entrance Scholarships from post secondary institutions (apply at the time of applications)
- **Private** Scholarships (non-profit organizations, community organizations, businesses, banks, unions, etc.) offer scholarships too! (RESEARCH!!!)

WHO CAN APPLY?

- Not always about marks
- Most scholarships recognize a WELL-ROUNDED student (those who balance school and life)
- Common criteria academic performance and/or financial need
- Variety of areas
 - ✓ Athletics
 - ✓ Visual and Performing Arts
 - ✓ Community Service
 - ✓ Environmental Activism
 - ✓ Technology
 - ✓ Trades (ie. Auto-mechanics, culinary arts, hairstyling)


OPPORTUNITIES EXIST FOR EVERYONE

What do you need to apply?

- 1. Transcripts School records
- 2. References 1-3 references
 - Teachers, coaches, employers, or community organization leaders that can speak to the student's qualifications and strengths.
 - Allow at least two weeks notice for letters to be written.


